- **3D** work may be attempted in this examination.

Final piece

- **2D** work paper size would be a minimum of A4 and a maximum of A2.
- **3D** work maximum size 60 cm in any dimension. (Sculpture in the round/relief).
- Where possible candidates should develop ideas from observation and first hand experience. Direct copying of existing pictures should be avoided although personal interpretation and development from visual imagery of all kinds is permissible.
- All questions carry equal marks.
